

## Open garden fundraiser 11 years in the making

IT'S been 11 years in making, but a secret Albany sanctuary will finally host its first Open Garden – and for a good cause.

More than 47 species of birds and 200 species of flowers and trees will be on display as Glenelg on King opens up to the public to raise money for YouthCARE Chaplaincy.

The event will be on Sunday, November 6, 10am-4.30pm and features live music.

Food and drink will also be available for purchase.

Organiser Jan Trigwell purchased the property in 2005 and had been developing the garden ever since.

“My Dad hosted an Open Garden fundraiser for YouthCARE in Mundaring for 15 years and so this is in memory of him,” she said.

“There will be plenty to see and smell and there are a few animals running around as well.

“I encourage people to come down and enjoy a beautiful part of our South West.”

Entry is \$10 for adults, \$5 for pensioners and children under 12 are free.
